THE NAILS

Put it in neutral this season, says manicurist Julie Kandalec, a backstage fixture at New York Fashion Week. "Since the fall runways were big on structured silhouettes, heavy pleats, and belted menswear, taupe nails are the perfect balance," says Kandalec. They're easy to wear but still have an edge, especially when teamed with a burgundy lip. "It's one of the chicest color combos for fall," she says. As for the nail shape? "Keep it oval."



THE EYES

So often a smoky eye goes in lockstep with red lips. But according to New York makeup artist Troy Surratt, founder of Surratt Beauty, a more modern approach is to opt for a shimmery nude cream shadow that won't compete with a high-impact lip. Full, natural-looking brows and light, feathery lashes emphasize eyes, but they don't detract from the main event.

THE LIPS

Red isn't the only way to do a power lip. "Burgundy reads as glamorous but also tough," Surratt says. It's fitting for the times: "Right now women have a lot to say, so dramatic lips feel appropriate." Surratt suggests topping a creamy Bordeaux lipstick with a slick of matching gloss to "create a patent leather finish." Too dramatic? He blots with Tatcha Original Aburatori-origami Japanese Beauty Papers (\$40 for 120). They mute color without removing too much pigment or shine.

THE SKIN

Balance a strong lip with luminous foundation. (Matte versions can look severe when worn with a deep lipstick.) "I like to use a humectant-rich formula since it creates natural-looking highlights," says Surratt, who applies base with a brush, then buffs with a moistened Beauty-blender sponge (\$20). "It lifts off residual product, so skin looks flawless, not made up." While many new foundations impart a glow, you can transform your favorite base by mixing in two drops of face oil (Surratt likes Colbert MD Illumino Face Oil, \$150). ■
